RENEWABLE ENERGY SECTOR GAINS MOMENTUM

Saudi Arabia may be best known as the world's largest oil producer, but the Kingdom is shifting its focus to other natural resources for domestic energy production. Heavy Lift General Manager, Rafael Vicens, explains the importance of the growing renewable energy sector, how it ties in to the country's Vision 2030, and the potential opportunities it opens up for Almajdouie Logistics.

Turki Mohammed Al Shehri, Head of the Kingdom's Renewable Energy Project Development Office, revealed that Saudi Arabia expects to start up to \$7 billion of renewable energy projects this year, particularly solar plants and wind farms. The projects, which will be awarded through a tendering process, aim to add more than 4 gigawatts (GW) of renewable energy capacity.

Almajdouie Logistics is looking forward to being involved in many of the logistics operations relating to these massive projects. Our dominant market position and extensive expertise in industrial projects logistics gives us a solid foundation to secure contracts for the construction of this new infrastructure.

The National Renewable Energy Programme (NREP) is a strategic initiative under the Vision 2030 and the National Transformation Programme, which aims to increase renewable energy capacity in the Kingdom to 9.5 GW (10 per cent of its total) by 2023.

The Renewable Energy Project Development Office, which is overseeing the NREP, aims to localise a significant portion of the renewable energy value chain in the Saudi economy. As a Saudi-owned company, this opens up considerable opportunities for Almajdouie Logistics.

Our expertise, skilled workforce, specialist equipment, and regional resources make us ideally placed to support the most sophisticated industrial projects logistics operations, regardless of the sector. Not only do we specialise in heavy lift transportation and installation on-site, we are always ready to take on new challenges.

While several key renewable energy projects are still in the bidding stage, others are gaining momentum. The 300MW Sakaka solar project, which was recently awarded to ACWA Power, will create job opportunities for more than 400 people and is scheduled to start commercial operation in 2019.

Projects such as this clearly reflect the Kingdom's commitment to diversification, especially in terms of energy production. The growing renewable energy sector has huge potential and provides plenty of opportunities for Almajdouie Logistics to utilise our skills and expand our know-how.

Almajdouie Logistics is launching a Hazard Identification and Risk Control Campaign, which will highlight the importance of taking proper corrective and preventive measures in the workplace.

One of the biggest causes of workplace injuries, illnesses, and incidents is the failure to recognise hazards. Therefore, it is crucial to have an effective system in place to identify and assess them before accidents occur.

Risk control is the next step in the hazard identification process and involves minimising risks in a hierarchical way. Eliminating the hazard is the best option (at the top of the hierarchy), whereas using personal protective equipment is considered to be the least effective option (at the bottom).

Almajdouie Logistics COO, Brent Melvin, said: "This campaign aims to help employees identify common workplace hazards, including working with harmful chemicals, display screen equipment, electricity, manual handling, loud noise, and working at height.

CAMPAIGN TO IMPROVE OUR SAFETY CULTURE

"By ensuring our employees are aware of potential hazards and know how to report them, we can avoid accidents and control risks throughout our operations."

Workplace injuries result in both direct and indirect costs. Direct costs are the most obvious and include medical expenses, compensation payments, and legal fees. Indirect costs, such as training replacement employees, accident investigations, lost productivity, and repairs to damaged equipment or property, are usually much higher.

By working together, we can build on Almajdouie Logistics strong safety culture and create an accident-free environment.

HEAVY UNITS SUCCESSFULLY DELIVERED TO FADHILI

Almajdouie Logistics' Heavy Lift team safely and successfully delivered a Amini regenerator column, weighing 276 tonnes, and four Amini contactor columns, weighing 174 tonnes each, from Olayan Descon in Jubail to Fadhili Gas Plant. The delivery, which was contracted by Tecnicas, included the engineering and transportation of the heavy units, covering a distance of approximately 80km.

NEW GANTRY CRANE FOR HEAVY LIFT OPERATIONS







Almajdouie Logistics recently added a new gantry crane service, which further expands our impressive heavy lift capabilities and opens up huge potential opportunities for us across the Middle East.

With a maximum capacity of 1,100 tonnes and a maximum height of 12 metres, it enables us to provide specialised lifting and installation services on-site where overhead cranes are limited by access. It is already being used to lift heavy equipment, ranging from 250-300 tonnes, at a power plant project in Fadhili.

Gantry cranes are ideally suited for the installation of heavy machinery, especially transformers, generators, and turbines. They provide substantial lifting capacity and are mobile, making them a great alternative to large, permanent systems.

Almajdouie Heavy Lift General Manager, Rafael Vicens, said: "Most heavy machinery has lifting points to enable installation, however, spatial constraints and working in congested areas can sometimes prohibit overhead cranes from being utilised. Alternatives such as jacking and sliding can be considered, but this option is often impractical when working at height. In such cases, gantry cranes are the best and safest choice."

This new equipment is a valuable addition to Almajdouie Logistics' asset portfolio and enables us to provide an even greater variety of services to customers across the region.

UNDERSTANDING EMAIL ETIQUETTE

Email is an important tool for any modern business, especially when communicating with clients, customers, and colleagues. Many professionals send countless emails daily and the process has become so routine that the importance of proper email etiquette is often overlooked.

By taking a few extra seconds to think and proofread before you click send, you can avoid common mistakes and ensure your message is professional, and conveys the right impression.

Be clear in your subject line

It should be simple and indicate what you have written about. Furthermore, it must match the message. Never open an old email, hit reply, and send a message that has nothing to do with the previous one.

Use proper spelling, punctuation and grammar

It not only gives clients more confidence in the person or the company communicating with them, it can help make your meanings clearer. If in doubt, use the automatic spell check or visit any of the numerous online applications.





Keep your message short and get to the point.

The person reading your email should not have to read through several paragraphs to figure out what you're asking. Also, before you click 'reply to all', ask yourself if all the recipients need the information in your message, if they don't, there's no point sending it to them.

Respond in a timely fashion

Depending on the nature of the email and the sender, replying within 24-hours is acceptable. If you find yourself busy and distracted with other tasks, you can set yourself a reminder to follow up.

Avoid using emoticons, jargon, slang, or informal abbreviations

If you wouldn't use an emoticon or smiley face on your business correspondence, you shouldn't put it in an email message, it has the potential to make you look less than professional.

Know your audience

Your email greeting and sign-off should be consistent with the level of respect and formality of the person you're communicating with.

Follow these simple steps and there's a better chance your email will up in the inbox, not the spam folder.
